PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear Church,

With just a couple weeks to go until my son is born, my wife and I have tried to get his room ready. We unboxed and cleaned up all sorts of things that we used when our daughter was a baby. The only thing we couldn't find was the cord for our baby monitor. I looked everywhere in order to find it, including a box of my daughter's old toys. I must admit it was kind of sad going through her plush animals, teething rings, "touch and feel" books, and finger puppets. It made me realize how fast she really has changed. For my wife and me, these things are tied to some of the most sacred memories of the early months of our daughter's life—but to her, they don't carry the same meaning. I wonder if you might feel this way when it comes to church.

In 2017 a lot of strong feelings have bubbled up that remind me of the way I felt about Charlotte's toy chest. I've heard some powerful sentiments about our worship. When I think about how strongly some folks feel about this stuff, I can't help but think about what those toys make me feel. Yes, I get warm and fuzzy feelings about her "Sophie the Giraffe" – but that was a teething toy that she used when she was an infant. Now she can recite her ABCs, count to somewhere in the mid-thirties, and figure out our cell phone pass codes to watch Netflix. Times have changed and the things that are meaningful to *her* are different than they are for us. This is kind of like church tradition and the feeling we get about the way things used to be, because some traditions bring you back to a time in your life where these things were sacred. When you don't experience that tradition because of some change, it can seem threatening or challenging to your sense of what church means to you. I think this is especially true in the world we live in today. When it seems like you can't go a day without hearing something terrible on the news – it's hard to come "home" to church and feel like things aren't the comfortable, familiar, safe bosom of Jesus that has been pretty much the same for half a century.

Sadly, the same doesn't seem to work anymore, because the world is different.



When it comes to church and worship, some of you have some very strong memories tied to certain aspects of the service that haven't been unearthed from "the toy chest" in a while. You've voiced frustration that things aren't the same as they were back when certain pastors served Christ Church long before I was born. I want you to know that I will do whatever I can to be inclusive and sensitive to those of you whom have been around Christ Church through the years, but the gift of having a young pastor is that you actually have a young pastor. I can't bring things back to the way they were before I was even a twinkle in my father's eye. I hate to dig in my heels, but I am not going to always pull what my predecessors did out of the past, nor am I going to tuck away everything they did either. What does this have to do with Christmas? Why on earth have I brought this up for our December article?

You know, every year we hear the same saga played out during Advent. The same old story takes place on Christmas Eve. We hear the same songs. We sing the same carols. We probably even light the same candles. This is the tradition that will never end up being outgrown. When it comes down to it, the story of Christ's birth and the hope it gives us – especially right now in a pretty hope-less feeling world, is the gift that will never find its way tucked away in a box. It is, along with the Easter morning story of Resurrection, the only real bosom of Jesus that we can come home to time and time and time again. Ministers are called and sent. Traditions are made and broken (and then new ones are made!). However, despite all that happens in the world around us or within the life of our congregation, the story of why we gather this December to hear of Jesus' birth will never change.

I'll admit that 2017 was a pretty rough year. If I had to live it over I'd give it a hard pass, but even in the midst of the ick – the Christ Child still shows up – and he will show up this year, too (and the next and the next). *This* story is what matters. Our story is what matters. Our story is *more* than robes and creeds, bulletins and newsletters, and candles and choirs. So even though *that* stuff might seem like its tucked away and we might miss it, the story of why we gather as a community of faith this Christmas will remain the same. May God bless you and keep you this Christmas and New Year.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER 1217: YEAR END REVIEW

Summary of Monthly Themes:

- **My Offering Box:** Contains 102 envelopes to help support the financial needs of our church and its outreach mission.
- **OGHS:** One Great Hour of Sharing is the Lenten offering of the United Church of Christ that supports partners in countries with ministries that fund health, education, and agricultural development, emergency relief, refugee ministries and both international and domestic disaster response.
- **Reflection:** "The gift of a smile." A smile cost nothing, but gives much. Yet it cannot be bought, begged or borrowed or stolen; for it is something that is of no value to anyone until it is given away. Some people are too tired to give you a smile. Give them one of yours, as none needs a smile as much as he who has no more to give. Smile, God loves you, and so do I.
- **Potato Chips:** Refer to the June/July Chronicles.
- **NIN:** Neighbors in Need is a special mission offering of the UCC that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of the offering is used by UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants.
- **Annual Report:** The general fund financials for the first three quarters of 2017 were given in a table shown. Also included was a table comparing stewardship giving for 2014-2016 showing the weekly average giving and the number of givers. This year's Stewardship theme was introduced
- **Our Financial Giving for 2018:** The question is - How much should I give? The answer is Make a promise with God for the hope of our church to fill every weekly offering envelop with your proportional giving amount. Challenge yourself to increase your giving by one percent. Refer to a weekly proportional giving table.
